In 1950 Raymond moved to California and embarked on a career at Lockheed Corporation. Starting in the stock room and quickly being promoted multiple times Raymond climbed up in the company and became a part of the Advanced Development Production. He was a part of the Skunk Works Team that designed and built the SR-71, the world's fastest and highest-flying manned aircraft. Raymond had a very successful 30-year career and retired in 1982.

At the age of 40 Ray said he was lucky once again and married a woman that "would put up with him!" They met at dance classes and their romance bloomed.
